Instructions for Beach Train



Please get ready to board 10 minutes before departure.



The order of boarding

1) pre-booked passengers

2) Passengers in order in case of re-boarding



No seats are assigned for any persons in the Beach Train, and the passengers may stand if all seats are occupied



Food is prohibited on board, and those under the influence of alcohol will be restricted from boarding.



If you use the 'Pass for two rides', you can get off at any station twice and finish the use.



'Pass for all stops' is available 'only once' at each station.



The Beach Train is considered an "amusement facility" rather than a mode of public transportation. Therefore, departure, arrival, and travel times are subject to change or delay.



Please follow the instructions of the staff for any other cases.

Instructions for Sky Capsule



The reservation time is the entrance time. If you make a reservation from 11:00 to 11:30, you can enter between 11:00 to 11:30, and boarding can be made after 11: 30 according to circumstances



Boarding may be delayed depending on holidays and on-site conditions.

Parking information for Haeundae Blueline Park



Mipo Station (Mechanical Parking Lot) 2-hour discount available (700 KRW/10 min, 21,000 KRW/day) credit card/mobile payment, no cash accepted



Songjeong Station (Outdoor Parking Lot) 2-hour discount available (500 KRW/10 min, 15,000 KRW/day) credit card/mobile payment, no cash accepted

No discounts available on the parking lot except for the ones on the top.

When you pay, please use the barcode at the bottom of the ticket to get a 2-hour discount.

(Please note that there is no refund for the payment without applying the discount.)

Parking discount applies to one car per each receipt. Beach Train



In the Haeundae-Mipo section, the Haeundae beach, Dongbaekseom island, and Gwangandaegyo bridge are situated on the right side of the sea. In the center, you can enjoy views of Igidae and Orvukdo Island.



According to the Korea Hydrographic and Oceanographic Agency (KHOA), the sea in front of Haewoljeong Pavilion at Dalmaji Hill marks the boundary between the East Sea and the South Sea. On clear days, you can observe Japan's Tsushima Island from the 11 o'clock direction. The distance from this location to Tsushima Island is approximately 48 km.



This section was infiltrated by a North Korean spy ship in 1985 and has remained closed to public access for the past 30 years. Recently, Mongdol Beach (Pebble Beach) has been opened, allowing visitors to experience a healing moment while listening to the soothing sound of waves crashing on pebbles.

Cheongsapo is renowned for its stunning sunrises and sunsets. The crosswalk in front of Cheongsapo Station has gained popularity for resembling a scene from the Japanese animation "Slam Dunk." This spot is a frequented photo location for tourists, offering a unique view created by the combination of the sea, road, and the Haeundae Beach Train



Songjeong Beach is a sanctuary where one can escape the hustle and bustle of the city, immersing oneself in the beauty and purity of nature. Renowned as a family-friendly summer resort, the beach is characterized by its shallow waters and gentle slopes. Not only a favorite destination for families, but this Beach is also celebrated as a surfing mecca, drawing surfers year-round and adding a lively ambiance to the location.



The stretch of road from Gudeokpo to Cheongsapo and Mipo is known as 'Haeundae Sampo-qil.' Gudeokpo is particularly charming, with numerous restaurants and cafes exuding an emotional atmosphere, making it an ideal spot to create memories while enjoying the seaside view, Additionally, you can take a leisurely walk and experience the tranquil atmosphere at Gudeokpo Breakwater.



The 'Daritdol Observatory,' featuring a floor made of transparent glass, offers a thrilling experience of walking in the sky above the sea. Admission to the Daritdol Observatorv is free, but access may be restricted during strong winds or rain for safety reasons.
